British Columbia Emergency Health Services in Boston Bar

According to Fraser Valley Regional Director Diane Johnson, "Everything is right on target! Our ambulance station is transitioning to full time permanent staffing as of April 1st!"

As yet, not all positions have been filled but the recruitment team continues to work through the several stages of the hiring process.

It is also the aim of BCEHS to bring back the **Community Paramedic Program** to Boston Bar. CPs work with health care providers, including physicians, nurses, and social workers, to determine and meet an individual's health needs. The Covid-19 pandemic impacted the ability of Community Paramedics to deliver non-emergent and preventive health services to individuals and as a result, the CP program stalled.

Another posting for the Boston Bar Community Paramedic position is coming out soon. Currently, the CP recruitment team is working on initiatives to attract paramedics provincially to these beneficial Community Paramedic positions.

"Hopefully the CP position for our community will be filled through the next posting", said Director Johnson.

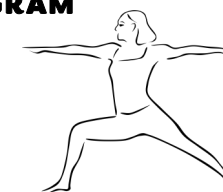

British Columbians Struggling Under Soaring Gas Prices

For nearly a decade, families across British Columbia have faced escalating costs in almost every aspect of daily life, from buying groceries to affording housing. These rising expenses have placed a significant burden on B.C. families, making it increasingly challenging to manage the costs of everyday life.

Despite this worsening affordability crisis, David Eby's NDP government is set to further exacerbate the issue with a 23 percent increase in the provincial carbon tax on April 1, 2024. This means that you will have to pay more for the fuel you use to get to work and school.

This also has significant consequences for small communities like ours. We don't have access to reliable transportation, yet we now need to pay more for fuel. This comes at a time when B.C. is already home to the highest gas prices and taxes in North America.

It's time for the pain at the pumps to end.

Under a Kevin Falcon-led BC United Government, we commit to making life more affordable by permanently eliminating the provincial fuel tax, saving families 15 cents per litre on gasoline and diesel. We would also halt the NDP's planned increases to the carbon tax.



IN MY OPINION

THE TAX EVERYONE LOVES TO HATE by Tom Durrie

Everyone hates Trudeau's carbon tax. Imagine having to pay an extra dollar or more at the pump because of Justin Trudeau. But wait a minute! If you're in BC you're not paying a Trudeau tax at all. British Columbia has its own carbon tax, and was the first province in Canada to introduce one. When Gordon Campbell was premier, in 2009, British Columbia joined the Western Climate Initiative with Arizona, California, New Mexico, Oregon, and Washington to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by charging a tax. In 2028 (Yes, that was Justin Trudeau.) the federal government introduced the Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act, joining Argentina, Chile, China, Colombia, Denmark, the European Union (27 countries), Japan, Kazakhstan, Korea, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Singapore, South Africa, Sweden, the UK, and Ukraine, all countries that already had a carbon tax system in place. In Canada, Quebec, British Columbia, Alberta, Ontario, Manitoba, and Nova Scotia opted out because they each have their own system for taxing pollution.

Does it work? For all intents and purposes, the answer is yes. Here are some examples:

- ⇒ Not only does the tax discourage polluting activities, it also provides incentives for research, investment, and deployment of more efficient and low emission alternatives. It is one of the most effective ways to reduce emissions.-- *Matthew Kotchen, Professor of Economics, Yale University.*
- ⇒ Six years after the policy was instituted, BC's fuel use is down a whopping 16.1%. Its economic growth has kept pace with the rest of Canada. And its personal and corporate income tax rates are now among the lowest in Canada. In short, the numbers indicate that BC's carbon tax shift has been a remarkable success, environmentally and economically.--*Smart Prosperity Institute.*
- ⇒ After British Columbia's provincial government introduced a carbon tax in 2008, greenhouse emissions were reduced, fossil fuel use in British Columbia had fallen by 16 percent, as compared to a 3 percent increase in the rest of Canada, and its economy outperformed the rest of the country. This proved that carbon tax benefits were no longer theoretical and that they did not hinder economic growth.--*The Atlantic.*

Believe it or not as you choose, but you'll find numerous reports showing that the carbon tax is actually doing what it's supposed to do. But does it work for individuals? It certainly won't stop me from driving or from heating my home, but then I get a quarterly GST and Carbon Tax rebate. That's why the tax is called revenue neutral. Last year I received a total of \$1,363.26. Not bad. It's more, I'm sure, than I ever spent on carbon taxes.

How about you?
