
A YEAR IN REVIEW

As 2023 comes to a close, I would like to recognize this community's resilience in the face of the ongoing wildfire impacts, and the affordability, healthcare, and overdose crises. Our province is dealing with so many challenges, and to see our communities come together during this time is truly remarkable.

B.C. has the highest gas prices and gas taxes in North America, the highest rental costs in the country, and the most unaffordable housing in North America. 1-in-5 British Columbians do not have a family doctor and the NDP's reckless decriminalization experiment has led to a surge of open drug use in our communities.

BC United has been a voice for change throughout 2023. We questioned government on their reckless decriminalization plan, until they finally introduced legislation to restrict the public consumption of illicit substances. We spent weeks debating their Emergency and Disaster Management Act, as it doesn't provide enough support for evacuees. And we've highlighted the NDP's costly CleanBC plan that will shrink our economy by \$28 billion over the next ten years.

In the year ahead, I - and the rest of the BC United team - will continue to advocate on your behalf to achieve real results that lessen the burden of everyday life. I wish you all a healthy and safe, Happy New Year.



POSITIVE PROGRESS ON CANYON SIGN PROJECT AMIDST CLIMATE CHALLENGES

Despite climate-related challenges, significant strides have been made in the creation of interpretive and gateway signs for the Fraser Canyon Sign Project.

The completed sign designs and content, crafted for installation at Yale Rest Stop and along the highway south of Lytton, are now available for public review. **Lori Pilon, Project Manager** welcomes stakeholders to provide input on the design concepts and content panel, attached with this release.

Geotechnical work is currently underway at both sites, a crucial step towards finalizing installation specifications and the tender package. The fabrication process and necessary permits from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI) are scheduled throughout the winter, setting the stage for sign installation by the <u>end of March</u>.

The Fraser Canyon Sign Project Team anticipates an unveiling celebration in the spring and expresses gratitude for the ongoing interest and support from the community.


