
WORKING HARD FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES

Unfortunately, the legislation the NDP introduced still had critical gaps in each of these areas and will likely serve to increase the burden placed on evacuees and municipalities during and following a disaster. People can expect to have to jump through more bureaucratic hurdles as a result of this legislation.

Through this bill, the Minister can require City Councils to report on any matter which includes risk assessments, emergency management plans, and business continuity plans, leaving our small communities to juggle another added pressure.

FRASER CANYON TELEVISION ASSOCIATION—CABLE UPDATE

On August 29, 2022 I received a Service Bulletin from Shaw Broadcast Services informing me that **Telesat's ANIK F2 satellite** was in rapid decline and experiencing technical anomalies threatening the serviceable life of the satellite.

Shaw Broadcast Services uses Telesat's ANIK F2 satellite to serve customers from coast to coast and they expected customer service impacts across Canada as early as December 2022, with the largest impacts to be realized in Northern Canada.

Fraser Canyon TV receives approximately half of our 45 channel line up off of satellite ANIK F2, which is the reason we have all been experiencing major disruptions in service.

Over the past few months Shaw Broadcast in coordination with **Telesat** and **CommScope** have been working on new technology in preparation to move all services off of satellite **ANIK F2 over to satellite ANIK G1**, which is not experiencing any technical issues. They have successfully completed and tested this new technology and are ready to start moving all services starting in November 2023 and continuing through **February 2024**, at which time they expect to have **ALL SERVICES TRANSITIONED**.

As services are switched from satellite ANIK F2 on to ANIK G1 we will make the changes based on the dates and location on ANIK G1 provided by Shaw Broadcast.

I thank you all for your ongoing patience and understanding as I continue to oversee the necessary changes to keep TV within our community.

FROM OUR ELECTORAL AREA A DIRECTOR

It is fact and not fiction that Abbotsford and Chilliwack have closed their waste water treatment plants to any septic tank waste being brought into their plant from outside their municipal boundaries. Approximately two weeks ago the hauling companies were given a letter letting them know the closure was now in affect. The haulers had been given 'a heads up' about a year ago and the municipalities were hopeful that the haulers would source out other options. This didn't happen. Staff from the FVRD have been working on finding out who will accept septic tank waste. To date they have heard that Kelowna, Vernon and Vancouver Island will accept it. This is not a practical solution to the problem. They are continuing to work on short term and long term solutions. I also met with 6 of the staff from the Ministry of Municipalities to discuss this—I see it as a province wide problem. I will keep you posted. In the meantime, there is a company coming to haul for some Boston Bar folks. Their contact information is: Bridge River Management, Lillooet Disposal, phone 1-250-256-4061

Lastly, we are facing some issues with the Fire Underwriters and we desperately need to have more willing and able-bodied people to join the **Volunteer Fire Department**. **PLEASE** come and check things out at fire practice, held every Wednesday night at 6 pm at the Fire Hall.
