SMALL CHANGES ~ BIG SAVINGS

In a time when global volatility is reshaping everything from grocery bills to housing costs, nearly everyone is feeling the strain on their finances. Economic uncertainty has a way of touching every household, regardless of income or circumstance, and it's prompting folks to rethink how they spend, save, and plan for the future. The good news is that practical strategies can help people regain a sense of control and build resilience. With a few intentional shifts, anyone can start finding ways to save money—even in these unpredictable times.

Across our province, from small mountain towns to coastal communities, shopping local has become more than a feel-good slogan—it's a lifeline. By choosing to spend our dollars close to home, we're helping to keep neighbours employed, supporting families who run small businesses, and strengthening the local economy in a way that big chains and online giants simply can't replicate. In rural and semi-rural areas especially, every transaction has a ripple effect: a thriving local shop means more job stability, more services, and a sense of community. And in a province where transportation costs, supply chain challenges, and global volatility can hit hard, keeping our dollars circulating locally helps buffer our communities from outside 'shocks'.

Growing a garden is one of the simplest ways to save money while putting fresh, healthy food on the table. Even a small plot can replace costly produce, and container gardening makes it possible for anyone — renters, balcony growers, and those with limited space — to grow herbs, greens, tomatoes, and more. Containers are inexpensive, easy to move, and let you garden in sunny spots without needing a full yard. Whether it's a few pots on the porch or a full backyard bed, growing your own food stretches the grocery budget and brings a bit of joy to the season.

Another way to save money is to take a closer look at how and when we use electricity. BC Hydro offers several billing options, and residential customers can choose the plan that best fits their household. You can switch plans anytime through your online account.

- * With the Tiered Rate, you pay a lower price for electricity up to a set threshold each billing period; once you pass that limit, any additional use is charged at a higher rate. This works well for homes with average or lower electricity use.
- * The Flat Rate charges the same price per kilowatt/hour (kWh) no matter how much electricity you use, making it a good choice for higher-use households.
- * You can also add Time-of-Day (TOU) pricing to either plan. Under TOU, electricity costs the most in the evening and the least overnight, so shifting laundry, dishwashing, and other big tasks to off-peak hours can help lower your bill.

In times like these, every small step we take to cut costs truly adds up. Whether it's shopping local, growing a few vegetables, shifting when we use electricity, making simple changes around the home, we all have more power to save than we realize. By trying a little here and there, we can stretch our dollars further, support one another, and make life in the Canyon just a bit easier for everyone.

LIGHT UP THE HALL!

As mentioned, I was unable to attend the Landfill Society AGM held March 14th due to prior obligations, but my alternate Sam Walters was present and read my statement to the membership.

However, because I was absent, and for the sake of clarity and shared understanding, there are a few points I'd like to address.

At the Landfill Society's AGM prior to the most recent one, then Landfill Society President Dustin Singh, asked me to speak to the membership about the RFP process, which I did. He then asked for a show of hands to determine whether members supported moving forward with an RFP. All but three members—along with Dustin—indicated they were in favour. With that clear direction from the membership, it is difficult to understand how, just over a year later, the board of five chose to initiate legal action without consulting the taxpayers who will ultimately be responsible for the costs. Because this is an Area A matter, those legal fees fall directly to our taxpayers.

At the recent AGM, the Landfill Society stated that they are paying their own legal fees. However, it is important to remember that the LFS's funding comes from taxpayers. In effect, residents are paying for both the FVRD's legal representation and the Society's. Transparency and consultation are essential when public funds are being used in this way, and residents deserve to be fully informed.

I would also like to clarify the situation regarding LFS President Attila Banhegyi's email that went unanswered. His message was addressed to both Beth Klein in Finance and me: it was a finance-related question. I was also waiting for Beth's response. While the delay has been longer than anyone would like, the existence of an active court file means that Attila must direct any landfill-related inquiries through his legal counsel. I have communicated this to him. It would have been helpful if Beth had promptly conveyed the requested information to both Attila and me; I believe that may have prevented some of the recent confusion. Below is the Financial Plan for the landfill.

FVRD DIRECTOR REPORT, DIANE JOHNSON, ELECTORAL AREA A.



In my role as Area A Director, it is important to me to attend as many meetings as possible. Due to a family function that was booked months ago, I was out of town when the Landfill Society AGM took place. I appreciated that my alternate, Sam Walters was able to attend in my place to read the Public Statement on the Chaumox Landfill Contract Award.

I received the following information from Graham Brett, the East End Road Superintendent:

'Currently, the crews are cleaning out the cattle guards on Chaumox Road and sweeping open shoulders. We plan on staying with the open shoulder sweeping and bridge deck sweeping for the next week and a half. Once we get the bridge decks swept, crews will be setting up for washing these bridge decks and barrier runs adjoining the bridge decks.'

Third party pick-up sweepers will be used to sweep the concrete roadside barrier (CRB). Currently, the 3rd party sweepers are completing the CRB runs through Agassiz and Rosedale.

Potholes are of concern as well; Joe Campbell (EAM) and I discussed this today. Joe will have a team on these potholes this week, concentrating on the areas between Sawmill Creek to Sailor Bar Tunnel and Hell's Gate area to Nugget Corner.

We plan on purchasing roughly 10,000 litres of Spray Patch for HWY 1 through the Canyon. We will likely be focusing on the rough areas at Hells Gate, Hells Gate Tunnel, Ferrabee Tunnel and the Alexandra area. This work is tentatively booked for April/May as weather permits.

If you've heard a rumour that FVRD wants to combine Area A and Area B...it is not true. We have the same geo-study corridor and will be sharing an Official Community Plan (OCP). It is certainly more advantageous to combine the two areas in planning than to have staff duplicating the work.

Hello Everyone.

We wanted to share a few updates following our Annual General Meeting held on March 14th at Canyon Lanes.

First off, a **big thank you** to everyone who came out. We had over 50 members of the public attend and more than 30 property owners signed up and were added to the BB-NB Landfill Society's Register of Members. It was great to see such a strong local turnout and to hear your questions, ideas, and feedback. We truly value that kind of community involvement.

We held elections and are happy to welcome **Eric Phibbs** and **Amit Upadhyaya** as new Directors. **Kathy Walters** was also re-elected. All three of these positions are for three-year terms.

The Landfill Society has been selected through the Request for Proposals (RFP) process to continue operating the landfill and we are currently working through contract negotiations with the Fraser Valley Regional District (FVRD).

Several key resolutions were unanimously passed at the AGM. In summary:

- * Continue permitted wood waste acceptance despite the FVRD's attempt to prohibit it
- * Pursue a waste disposal agreement with local First Nations
- * Advocate to reduce C&D rates from \$300 to \$150 per tonne

The legal matter between the Landfill Society and the FVRD remains ongoing. We will continue to keep the community informed as things progress.
