



UPDATE AUGUST 2018

EXTREME HEAT MEANS EXTREME WILDFIRE RISK



Fire Danger Rating is updated <u>daily</u> and can be viewed at bcwildfire.ca

Our area (Coastal Fire Zone) is in extreme danger. Forest fuels are very dry and the fire risk is serious. New fires will start easily, spread rapidly, and challenge fire suppression efforts.

PROHIBITIONS ARE NOW IN EFFECT:

The following are NOT permitted.

Campfires

Category 2 & 3 Open Fires

Chimineas

Tiki Torches

Stoves and other portable campfire apparatuses which are not CSA or ULC approved

Burning barrels or burning cages of any size or description Sky Lanterns

Exploding binary gargets (e.g. target practice)

Fireworks

Air Curtain Burners

A ticket for "lighting, fuelling or use of fire against regulations" carries a fine of \$1,150 and would apply to every person in the vicinity of the fire.

To report a wildfire or open burning violation, call 1 800 663-5555 toll-free or *5555 on a cellphone. For upto-date information on current wildfire activity, burning restrictions, road closures and air quality advisories, call **1 888 3-FOREST** or visit: www.bcwildfire.ca

The Coastal Fire Centre would like to remind the public about applicable fines for open burning violations:

- Section 2, Fail to report fire: \$383
- Section 3 (1), Drop, release or mishandle burning substance: \$575
- Section 3 (2), Fail to extinguish burning substance: \$575
- Section 5 (1), Light, fuel or use fire against regulations: \$1,150
- Section 5 (2) (a), Fail to extinguish fire: \$575
- Section 5 (2) (b), Fail to report fire: \$575

Boston Bar and North Bend were threatened recently by two fires which were promptly reported and extinguished by our local VFD members and BC Wildfire Service. At this time of year, our environment is vulnerable to both extreme weather conditions and too often, irresponsible human activity. Let's all remain alert.

PLEASE HAVE AN EVACUATION PLAN IN PLACE for your family, pets and livestock. Keep in mind also, the safety of friends and neighbours who are elderly or disabled, possibly live alone and/or do not have access to transportation.





From Terry Raymond, Director Electoral Area A

As well as attending FVRD meetings I have participated in a number of tourism-oriented sessions regarding the Gold Rush Trail promotions.

I made a one-day trip to Victoria to meet with the Executive Director and Director of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure. The purpose of this meeting was to make certain that the Ministry is still on-side with the proposed refurbishing and enhancement of Alexandra Park and Alexandra Bridge. The meeting went well and all travel costs were covered by New Pathways to Gold Society and not by our tax payers. You can visit the Transportation & Infrastructure website at www.qov.bc.ca/tran/

There have been ongoing issues with the rail tie chipping plant (creosote). They are still working on the required fire plan. As well, the owners have not as yet moved the creosote log pile further away from surrounding residences in order to reduce the smell. We continue to meet to find resolution to these issues.

We are now actively looking for property to construct a new fire hall in Boston Bar as the new owners of **Fas Gas have insisted on a \$1200.00 a month rental fee** for the land and have further stated that they do not want practices to take place there. Going back as far as the Harrington family, all subsequent owners have recognised the importance of our fire department and allowed for the fire hall to be on that land, free of charge.

It is our belief that we can build a new hall for the same monthly fee that is being charged for the land rental. The existing hall is in dire need of repairs. Once I have a better knowledge of projected costs and have a proposed location for a new fire hall, I will be holding a <u>well-advertised public meeting</u>. Other topics will be covered including an update on the **water plant proposal** and we will also have an open discussion on the anticipated **recycling program**.

As well as helping seniors stay in their homes longer by providing minor housecleaning and household maintenance, there is a weekly shuttle bus service to Hope and Chilliwack for shopping and appointments. *Subsidy for the shuttle service is dependent upon a senior's verified income level.
