Forestry is in many ways the cornerstone of economic activity in B.C.—responsible for creating over 140,000 jobs around the province and contributing \$13 billion to the GDP. Aside from its economic value on a provincial level, forestry also plays an integral role in dozens of communities across B.C. This central role makes the current forestry crisis even more devastating.

I have recently hosted stakeholder meetings about the forestry crisis with some of my BC Liberal Caucus colleagues, hearing first hand from locals about the challenges they are facing and the issues that matter to them most. There were several major themes that developed in our discussions. The need for support for employees, families and communities impacted by mill closures and curtailments was on the top of everyone’s minds, as was the issue of declining fibre supply due to pine beetles and fires. We discussed the need for government policies and incentives that support the forestry industry and ensure the maximum value for each log harvested.

The BC Liberal Caucus has outlined a detailed forest sector recovery plan which provided recommendations to the Premier—although we are still waiting for a reply. While the government’s silence is discouraging, it will not stop us from continuing to work for the good of British Columbians.

7.3 EVACUATION ROUTE CONSIDERATIONS (continued from page 1)

The majority of evacuee movement will take place on roadways and highways, in both personal vehicles, and public and private transit vehicles coordinated by the First Nation or Local Authority. However, consideration should also be given to alternative methods (air, rail, marine, etc.) especially in locations with single or limited exit routes.

Local transportation staff, police, the Incident Commander for the emergency incident, available hazard-specific subject matter experts including Traditional Indigenous Knowledge Keepers and technical specialists, EMBC, and the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MoTI) will be able to assist in determining the best evacuation routes.

Key considerations for evacuation routes include, but are not limited to:

- Number and geographic distribution of evacuees
- Available transportation resources – public transport, school, private
- Capacities and vulnerabilities of transportation infrastructure and network
- Potential for congestion, bottle necks
- Areas vulnerable to damage
- Available facilities, e.g. fuel supplies (internal/external of jurisdiction)
- Vehicle breakdown contingencies (internal/external of jurisdiction)
- Access control and security of evacuated area
- Coordination of evacuation routes with the appropriate authority, including BC Parks, District Office of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNROROD), and MoTI to ensure all recommended evacuation routes are open, and to confirm road conditions and current industrial use
- Usage of assembly points to provide a safe staging area for individuals to congregate while waiting for transportation to a Reception Centre

If you are a person that doesn't feel that you need to wear safety gear then please know your physical imitations and make sure there is no strong water current or undertow where you are swimming. Take care with your pets too! There are PFD's for them as well!

*There's a difference! **A **lifejacket** is designed to turn an unconscious person from face down to face up in the water, allowing them to breathe. Lifejackets are more buoyant than PFDs. They must be orange, yellow or red and have a whistle attached. **A personal flotation device** is designed to keep you afloat in the water and they are generally smaller and less bulky than a lifejacket. They have less flotation than lifejackets and come in a variety of styles and colours.*

THIS IS MADE POSSIBLE THROUGH A FRASER HEALTH GRANT, CLIENT DONATIONS, GRANTS FROM OUR LOCAL CORPORATE SPONSORS, ALONG WITH GENEROUS LOCAL INDIVIDUALS, AND SERVICE CLUBS.

WE DO NOT RECEIVE ANY GOVERNMENT FUNDING. Our volunteer drivers use their own vehicles to provide this much needed door to door service.

Boston Bar Care Transit supplies transportation service to folks from our area that need to get to Anderson Creek Clinic for medical appointments, as well as specialist appointment or diagnostic procedures out of our area.
