#### UPDATE ON CREOSOTE RECYCLING AT JONES' MILL SITE

Recently, Lloyd Forman met with the principal owners of the creosote recycling business at the site. Owners are Wilfred and Carolyn Verchares. Their daughter contracted a serious disease from creosote exposure. That motivated Verchares to spend the last several years working on a solution to ensure safe disposal of wood treated with this dangerous chemical.

The correct amount of heat will break down the chemical solution and render it safe. Verchares has been selling his 'bio fuel' to the cement plant in Richmond for the past three years.

At the site here in Boston Bar, the creosote ties and wharf pilings which will have had approximately 2 inches removed from the outside of the forms, will then chipped and shipped out. The main body of the timbers will be cut into dimensional lumber. At this point in time, only the chip -ship process will happen here.

It is now recognized that creosote present in soil and water produces toxic effects. For that reason, Verchares' revolutionary processing could result in a major economic boost to our community, while providing a service that will be invaluable to all people everywhere.

#### F.V.R.D MEETS WITH AREA A LANDFILL SOCIETY

A very productive meeting was held in Chilliwack on November 22nd, with six community members and six regional district employees.

We (the landfill society) will produce a budget within a two week time frame of that meeting. There was a proposal put on the table that landfill profit would come back to the community as economic development money. The decision would be made at a well advertised town hall meeting where the community will have the opportunity to debate the issues and take a vote as to how to proceed going forward.

We will provide another update to our negotiations in a month's time.


