# UPDATE JULY 2021

Effective at noon (Pacific time) on Wednesday, June 30, 2021, campfires, and Category 2 open fires will be prohibited throughout the province of British Columbia.

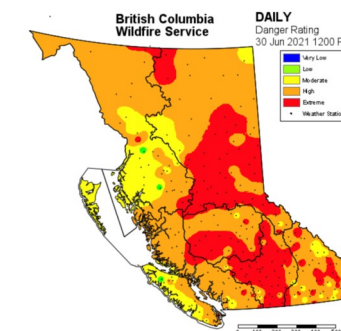
The following activities are also prohibited:

- ⇒ The use of sky lanterns
- ⇒ Fireworks
- ⇒ Burn barrels or burn cages
- ⇒ Binary exploding targets
- ⇒ Tiki and similar kinds of torches
- ⇒ Chimineas
- ⇒ Air curtain burners
- ⇒ Outdoor stoves or other portable campfire apparatus without a Canadian Standards Association (CSA) or Underwriter Laboratories of Canada (ULC) rating.
- ⇒ Use caution with generators, ATV's, and dirt-bikes



## Fire Danger Rating

The fire danger rating (i.e. the risk of a wildfire starting) for the province is updated daily at approximately 2 pm.



Anyone found in contravention of an open burning prohibition may be issued a violation ticket for \$1,150, receive a penalty of up to \$10,000 or be fined up to \$100,000 and/or sentenced to one year in jail. If the contravention causes or contributes to a wildfire, the person responsible may be ordered to pay all firefighting and associated costs.

## Almer Carlson Pool

The Almer Carlson Pool is an outdoor pool located in North Bend (across the Fraser River from Boston Bar). We are open for the 2021 season with COVID-19 safety measures in place. All activities must be pre-registered and will follow strict guidelines to ensure the health and safety of both patrons and staff.

### COVID-19 Safety Protocols

- » The pool will have reduced capacity to ensure physical distancing and amenities are limited
- » Swim times are pre-registered and registrants will be checked in at the pool
- » Patrons who are sick will not be allowed entry
- » Come dressed to swim as change rooms are unavailable (washroom is available for use)
- » Follow the safety signage around the pool
- » Expect enhanced cleaning and sanitization
- » Birthday parties and private rentals will not be offered
- » Pool toys and/or equipment will not be provided but you are welcome to bring your own
- » Snorkels are not permitted
- » Children under 7 must be accompanied by and stay within arms reach of a parent or guardian (16 years or older)

**Jackie Tegart, MLA Fraser-Nicola**

A few weeks ago, the Legislature wrapped up its spring session in Victoria. It's always a privilege to have the opportunity to represent my constituents in the Legislature, making sure that your voices are heard as we discuss and debate the laws of our province.

As expected, COVID-19 and the impacts of the pandemic were frequent topics of discussion. I worked with my BC Liberal colleagues to ensure that government provides the supports needed to keep people safe and businesses afloat. We've been calling for a private-sector jobs plan — particularly one for women and youth, who have been hit hard by pandemic job losses — and for government to get supports out the door to businesses as efficiently as possible.

Additionally, we discussed a piece of legislation that could have long-term impacts on representation in rural B.C. Right now, the government is looking into changes to electoral boundaries in the province, and this could mean that rural ridings are made larger. Increasing the size of ridings like Fraser-Nicola, where constituents already have to travel long distances to visit their MLA, means that it would be even more difficult for elected officials to effectively represent their region.

Representation on a local level is absolutely vital and I will keep working to ensure that all of my constituents feel represented in Victoria.

Both cohorts had a wonderful time and are looking forward to similar events next year.

In the following week, each class held an open house event where they displayed all of their learning. In addition, they were presented with their term four awards and each student received their Thompson awards and gifts presented by our Indigenous Support worker, **Mrs. Lillian Isaac**. The **grade 7-9 class** deserves special recognition for their slam poetry presentation. It was a wonderful show demonstrating the skills and talents of our intermediate students. Please take time to review our list of award winners below and congratulate each student on a job well done!

During our week of honoring we were able to squeeze in a special outdoor presentation from **Hope Mountain Center** for our **K-3's**. **Natalie Worrall** visited our school and taught a boisterous presentation on beavers. Everyone learned something new to take home and share with friends and families. As well, on **Thursday, June 17<sup>th</sup>**, all of our **senior students** and many **staff** members completed their level one First Aid thus bringing our eventful week to an end.

Finally, our last day of school for the elementary cohort was **Monday, June 21<sup>st</sup>** when we celebrated Indigenous Day. Students learned about traditional medicines, created salves and bug spray with local indigenous plants, crafted dream catchers and medicine shields and enjoyed bannock made into Indian Tacos. We would like to thank **Ms. Shoneena Loss, Mrs. Jenelle McMillan, Ms. Linda Campbell** and the **BBESS PAC** for their contributions and support on this very significant day.

School ended for our **Grade 7-9's** on **Thursday, June 24<sup>th</sup>**. As the **grade 10 and 11's** wrote their Provincial Numeracy and Literacy Assessments, the **grade 7-9 class** competed in two Skills Competitions. We celebrated with prizes, report cards and a pizza party. Later that day the staff said goodbye to four employees. **Ms. Perry** our **SEA** has come to the end of her contract but hopefully will be back next year. **Mrs. McMillan** is taking a year off to further her education and we hope to see her back in 2022. **Mrs. Weber** is leaving for a position at **Hope Secondary** and we wish her well in her new job and with great sadness we say farewell to **Ms. Fraser** who is retiring after more than two decades of dedication and caring for the students and families in **Boston Bar**. 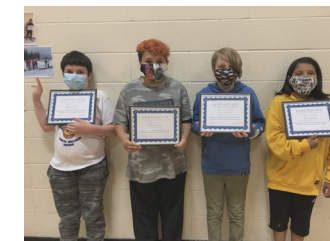
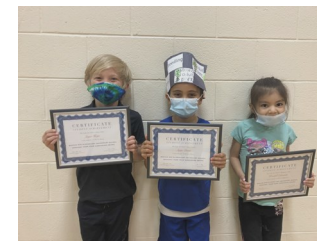
