CONSERVATIVE SHADOW MINISTER FOR HOUSING RESPONDS TO 2021 LIBERAL BUDGET

MISSION, BC – **Today Brad Vis, MP for Mission–Matsqui–Fraser Canyon** and Shadow Minister for Housing, responded to the 2021 Federal Budget, tabled in Parliament by the Liberal government: “The first budget in two years from this Liberal government continues down the path of unsustainable financial commitments paid for by future generations that will not secure long term prosperity for Canadians.

Instead, what Justin Trudeau has proposed is a “reimagined” Canadian economy that dabbles in risky economic ideas, like abandoning Canada’s world leading and sustainable natural resource industries, leaving our economy in a precarious position. Despite massive federal deficits, there are no measures to meaningfully address the ongoing housing affordability crisis – nothing that will make it easier for young Canadians and First Time Home Buyers to get into the housing market and barely a mention of the supply crisis across Canada.

The reality is that expanded taxes and government programs will not address the affordable housing shortage, the prevalence of foreign speculators in Canadian real estate, or the underlying causes of homelessness. Only within the context of a revived plan to get our economy back on track will we be able to meaningfully address these challenges.

Erin O’Toole has put forward Canada’s Recovery Plan, which is focused on creating financial security and certainty. This plan will safely secure our future and deliver a Canada where those who have struggled the most through this pandemic can get back to work.

Canada’s Conservatives got us out of the last recession and this federal budget makes it clear that Canada’s Conservatives are needed to do it again.”



Flooding In The Interior Needs More Attention

While spring is often a time of joy and renewal, it can also be a time of great concern for many of our communities in the Interior as it brings with it an event that has caused millions of dollars in damages to communities across the province. Every spring, people who live on or near a stream, river or lake watch with trepidation as the water begins to rise. This event, known as “spring freshet,” posed relatively little risk in the past but in recent years has become a seasonal danger for many communities in Fraser-Nicola.

The damages spring freshet causes are worsening for many reasons — mountain pine beetle, logging, wildfires, climate change and land usage have all affected the ability of the land to absorb water. Government could be taking steps to help communities better protect their homes, infrastructure, and businesses.

Government must start taking a proactive approach rather than a reactive one, consult with local communities and ask what can be done to prevent damages rather than what can be done to repair them. Giving our rural communities the tools and resources they need to reinforce our waterfronts, roads, and homes is a crucial step that will ensure seasonal flooding stops coming at a seasonal cost to our communities and our province.
