History

The name "Boston Bar" can be traced to St. Botolph from the Lincolnshire coast, who flourished in the year 654. By 900, he had been commemorated by a shire "Botolph's Stone" and the vicinity evolved to the port of Boston. The Pilgrim Fathers brought the name from Boston to New England port and became the major outfitting centre for maritime fur trading ventures on the Northwest coast. This led to "Boston men" becoming the west coast name for Americans at the end of the 18th Century.


As the 1858 gold rush worked its way up the Fraser River, the gravel bars were prospected for placer gold and were named, only if the area was worth working. Boston Bar was one of the more important placer gold bars; the name though relocated, remains firmly established. The original gravel bar was on the west side of the Fraser opposite the mouth of Anderson River. A rope ferry was used to cross the Fraser operated by W.H. Wetherill. On this first location a gold dredger was used for a short time. We have a photo of Bailey's dredger at the museum.

When the mule trail, and later the wagon road, were established along the east or left bank of the Fraser, the settlement moved there. About 1863, "Boston Bar" was laid out as a small curved town site along the Caribou wagon road and was drawn and traced by ubiquitous J.B. Launder of the Lands & Works Department of Royal Engineers.

The four northerly lots were assigned to Alexander Coutie, operator of the popular Boston Bar Roadhouse. He stayed until 1873, then moved up the trail to Nicola. In the town there was also a blacksmith, liquor shop and two stores.

During the winter of 1893, there was an extremely heavy snowfall, and with the subsequent Spring runoff, the village was almost washed away. The town site moved for the third time to about 1 1/2 miles north of the old site to its present location.

The CNR set its divisional point and yards on the first big flat area north of the abandoned Boston Bar town site.


